Weekly Maths	Weekly Reading
<p>Monday:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Log in to Education City. Go to the ‘Classwork’ section and click on the ‘Pictograms’ folder. Watch the video – Perfect Pictograms. ✓ Look at the ‘Travel pictogram’ and ‘Tasty fruit’ pictogram and answer the questions. ✓ Complete the ‘Summer Fair’ activity to show how to use and interpret pictograms. 	<p>Every Day:</p> <p>As always, reading is the most important home learning that your child can partake in. The activities below must be completed every day and the independent reading must involve reading to an adult or older sibling. The more reading, the better!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Log in to Bug Club using your own login. Read one book each day to an adult or older sibling. Complete the <i>Bug Notes</i> and <i>Bug Time</i> activities at the start and end of the reading book. Can your parent/carer ask you some comprehension questions about the book? ✓ Listen to a different story read to you by your parent or carer, or listen to a story from Storyline Online or cbeebies bedtime stories.
<p>Tuesday:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Go to the pictograms on the Topmarks website. Click on the Horizontal Pictograms which has unit=1 next to it and choose one thing to create a pictogram. Answer the questions about each pictogram. Click ‘again’ at the top of the page to get a new question. Click ‘main’ to choose a new amount for your pictogram. 	
<p>Wednesday:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Go to the pictograms on the Topmarks website. Click on the Horizontal Pictograms which has unit=? next to it and choose one thing to create a pictogram. Each picture will represent a different number which will be shown on the right-hand side of the screen. ✓ Log on to Mathletics and complete the picture graphs quiz. 	
<p>Thursday:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Log on to Numbots using your Times Table Rock Stars username and password. This will help you to practise your number bonds. ✓ Log in to Education City. Go to the ‘Classwork’ section and click on the ‘Addition and Subtraction’ folder. You will find the activity ‘Spin a Ring’ in which you must choose the correct 1-digit numbers to make a given total. 	
<p>Friday:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Log on to Times Table Rock Stars and play in the Garage or Soundcheck section. ✓ Log in to Education City. Go to the ‘Classwork’ section and click on the ‘Addition and Subtraction’ folder. You will find the activity ‘Snakes on the Brain’ in which you must solve addition and subtraction of two 2-digit numbers.

Learning Project – To be completed throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for you to gain a better understanding of your family. Learning may focus on how every family is different, what traditions your family has, discussing stories linked to your family etc.

Family Interviews

Choose family members to interview. These could be family members who live in your home or other family members. Write down some questions to ask them. Conduct your interviews and find out as much as possible about your family.

Family Art

Draw or paint a portrait of a family member.

Self Portrait

Create a picture of yourself. What materials could you use? Can you find different materials around the house to help? [Ideas to support](#).

Create a Card

Design a card for someone in your family. It can be a birthday card, thank you card or a card to tell someone how much you love them!

Family Tree

Look at photographs of your family members and discuss where they would go on a family tree. Have you met everyone? Is there anyone you could interview and find out more about?

Family Coat of Arms

Find out what a coat of arms is. Could you design a coat of arms for your family? What could go into the design? Think about the colours and shapes. Could they use cardboard to create a shield that the coat of arms could go on?

Family Booklet

Create an information booklet all about your family. Can you name the people in your family and write sentences about them? Who are they? What do you call them? Do they have a job or go to school? What do they like or dislike? Why are they special to you? Maybe you could get a photograph or draw each family member before you write about them.

Biography

After interviewing one of your family members, write a biography about their life so far.

Music from the Past

Your child can research music from the decade their parents, grandparents or other older family members were born. What were the most popular bands or singers during this time? Ask them to perform a song from this decade and create their very own dance routine. Encourage them to explain how they need to improve their performance in order to achieve their personal best.

Mapping Skills

Identify the countries or cities within the UK where their family members originate from or live. Children can then plot these on a map and then create a bar chart to show the number of family members who live/lived in each city/country.
